ACRONYM GLOSSARY

CAA:

Community Action Agency - local private and public non-profit organizations that carry out the Community Action Program (CAP). In Jackson County, our CAA is ACCESS.

CBO:

Community-Based Organization - for example, Rogue Action Center, Unete, United Way of Jackson County, etc.

CCO:

Catholic Charities of Oregon OR Coordinated Care Organization

- Catholic Charities of Oregon—current administrator of local FEMA proscribed Disaster Case Management Program, a subcontractor of Saint Vicent de Paul.
- Coordinated Care Organization—a network of all types of health care providers (physical health care, addictions, mental health care, and dental care providers) who work together in their local communities to serve people who receive health care coverage under the Oregon Health Plan (Medicaid). The two CCOs in Jackson County are:
 - o AllCare Health
 - Jackson Care Connect

CCR:

Center for Community Resilience is ACCESS's wildfire recovery program. The CCR provides housing case management to support the ongoing transition of Jackson County 2020 wildfire survivors still living in hotels or other housing situations into quality, affordable and permanent housing. Housing case management services are currently available to 2020 wildfire-impacted households.

CDBG-DR:

Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Relief, rebranded as ReOregon

COAD:

Community Organizations Active in Disasters. The national network of businesses and individuals who are there to respond quickly to disasters. In our case, the local COAD (Rogue Valley COAD) is led by boardmember Mark Pederson, who helped set up donations of goods at The Expo, which served as the evacuation center for people who had to leave their homes due to the fires.

CRP:

Community Recovery Plan, now the Regional Long Term Recovery Plan (R-LTRP). Finally branded as Rogue Reimagine.

DCM:

Disaster Case Managers—state-funded individuals conducting needs assessments and connecting survivors to resources. Currently, seven work under Catholic Charities, two with Rogue Community Health, and four under ODHS

DLCD:

Department of Land Conservation and Development is a small state agency that works in partnership with local governments, and state and federal agencies, to address the land use needs of the public, communities, regions, and the state.

EDA:

Economic Development Agency, manages SBA loans and works on economic recovery.

FEMA:

Federal Emergency Management Agency

FEMA VAL:

Volunteer Agency Liaisons, the people who help direct FEMA response in individual disaster areas. Regionally based.

HUD:

Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Federal agency responsible for national policy and programs that address America's housing needs, that improve and develop the Nation's communities, and enforce fair housing laws. HUD's business is helping create a decent home and suitable living environment for all Americans, and it has given America's communities a strong national voice at the Cabinet level. HUD plays a major role in supporting homeownership by underwriting homeownership for lower- and moderate-income families through its mortgage insurance programs. They administer the CDBG-DR program at the Federal level.

Jackson County Community Long-Term Recovery Group

HAJC:

Housing Authority of Jackson County

HARP:

ODHS:

Oregon Department of Human Services, which handles the transitional sheltering and hotel funding. Also manages grants for organizations doing services to survivors

ODEM:

The Oregon Department of Emergency Management coordinates and maintains a statewide emergency services system for emergency and disaster communications. OEM is made up of four Sections: Director's Office, Technology and Response, Operations and Preparedness, and Mitigation and Recovery Services.

OHCS:

Oregon Housing and Community Services provides resources for Oregonians to reduce poverty and increase access to stable housing.

PIER:

RCH:

Roque Community Health

ReOregon:

CDBG-DR funding for post-disaster recovery. OHCS is the state conduit for this funding to our community. Programmatic buckets include:

- HARP
- HOP
- PIER

RFA:

Request for Application. Frequently tied to a grant opportunity for organizations, e.g., RFA partners of Rogue Community Health, subcontracted to do work outlined in an ODHS grant for wraparound services for fire survivors.

SBA:

Small Business Administration, loans to small businesses. Also plays a key role in disaster recovery, offering low interest rate loans to eligible households as part of FEMA's Individual Assistance (IA) program.

SBDC:

Small Business Development Center. Offers advising and training programs to assist small businesses with planning and finding resources. Locally, ours is located at Southern Oregon University

SOREDI:

Southern Oregon Regional Economic Development Initiative, the local Economic Development District. Focus is one market traded sector; e.g., manufacturing, midto large-sized businesses.

TGM Program/Grant:

The Transportation and Growth Management (TGM) Program is a partnership of the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development and ODOT, which helps local governments across Oregon with skills and resources to plan long-term, sustainable growth in their transportation systems in line with other planning for changing demographics and land uses.

In 2020, Jackson County, along with the Cities of Talent and Phoenix, requested assistance from the TGM Program for a revisioning of the Oregon Highway 99 corridor to help shape the redevelopment of the region following the Almeda Fire.
